Witnessed that the said party of the first part, for and consideration of the sum of

to hand paid by the said party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have Granted, Bargained and Sold, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain and Sell unto the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, all the following described lot, piece or parcel of land, situated in South Moline in the County of Rock Island and the State of Illinois, to wit:

A lot, piece or parcel of Land Ten Rods (10 rods) long
East and West By Eight Rods (8 rods) wide North and South
situate in the North East corner of the North West
Quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of the South West Quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of Section
No. Two (2) in Township No. Seventeen (17) North
Range No. One (1) West of the Fourth (4th) Principal
Meridian -

To be used by the said George Weaver his
heirs and assigns as and for a Cemetery forever



Together with all and singular the hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging, or in any wise appertaining, and the reversion and reversions, remainder and reversioners, rents, issues, and profits thereof; and all the estate, right, title, and interest, claim and demand whatsoever, of the said party of the first part, either in law or equity, or in and to the above bargained premises, with the hereditaments and appurtenances To have and hold the said premises above bargained and described, with the appurtenances unto the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns forever. And the said party of the first part hereby expressly waives, releases, and relinquishes, unto the said party of the second part, his heirs, executors, administrators, and assigns, all right, title, claim, interest, and benefit, whatever, is and to the above described premises, underlaid and every presumption which is given by or results from all laws of this State pertaining to the Exemption of Homesteads.

And the said John D. Weaver, party of the first part, for himself his heirs, executors and administrators, does covenant, grant, bargain, and agree to and with the said party of the second part, heirs and assigns, that at time of the making and delivery of these presents he is well seized of the premises above conveyed as of a good, sure, perfect, absolute, and indefeasible estate of inheritance in law, in fee simple and has good right, full power, and lawful authority to grant, bargain, sell and convey the same in manner and form aforesaid, that the same are free and clear from all former and other grants, bargains, sales, leases, tenns, easements, and incumbrances of what kind and nature soever; and the above bargained premises in the quiet and peaceable possession of the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, against all and every person or persons lawfully claiming or to claim the whole or any part thereof, the said party of the first part shall and will WARRANT AND PRYOR DEFEND.
