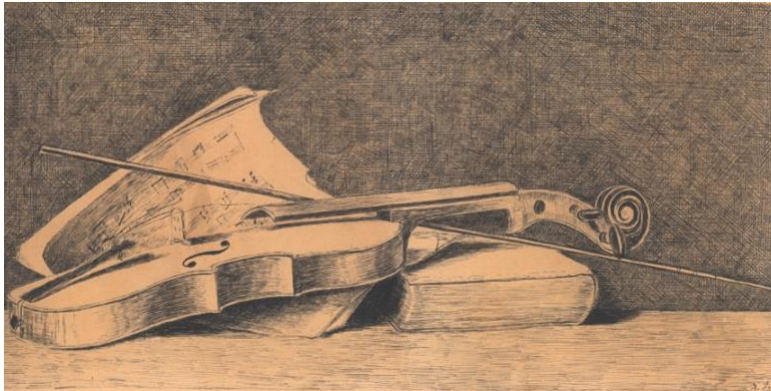


Nora Jamieson

Nora Jamieson was born in Moline on October 16, 1872. She graduated from high school in 1892 and attended Knox College. She was an accomplished artist and designer. She lived for a time with her mother and sisters in Ann Arbor, Michigan where she worked for Edwards Printing and Photography. She spent 4 years in Cincinnati, Ohio where she was a designer and retoucher for a pottery company.

She left her job in Cincinnati because of ill health and returned to Ann Arbor. She died unexpectedly on October 19, 1910 following an appendix operation.

Several of Nora's art works are known. An ink drawing of a violin is owned by Becky McLaughlin Dexter, a watercolor of a bowl of fruit owned by Bill McLaughlin, and a still life with berries and jam owned by Maude Easter. A collection of her poems, many of which were published, is also owned by Maude Easter.
